Statewide Health Planning and Development The Department of Health Care Services and the Department of Managed Health Care ("the departments") jointly conducted the network adequacy assessment. Healthy Families Program enrollees will transition from a Healthy Families Program plan that currently does not have a contract with the Department of Health Care Services, so the departments concentrated on understanding how plans would provide continuity of care to transitioning enrollees and evaluating the overall capacity of the plans to provide care for the transitioning population. Their analysis and the description of continuity of care activities are detailed in the Network Adequacy Assessment Report.

Based on the data reviewed, the Phase 3 Medi-Cal managed care plan networks all appear to have adequate capacity to serve transitioning and new enrollees. In the case of Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, as noted in the Network Adequacy Assessment Report, Kaiser indicates that it is in the process of subcontracting with several Phase 3 Medi-Cal managed care plans. Thus, assuming these subcontracts are executed, Kaiser Healthy Families Program members would not experience any visible change in their health care provider or plan as a result of the transition. The departments plan to continue to communicate with plans about their networks as Phase 3 approaches and have detailed plan-specific follow-up in the Network Adequacy Assessment Report.

We welcome and appreciate feedback from you, your staff, and stakeholders as we continue through this process. We are focused on making this process as smooth as possible for children and their families.
